Migration Matters: Short Course

May 8th 2017 – 26th June 2017



With an estimated 244 million international migrants in the world today, including over 20 million refugees, migration is having a significant impact on nations and faith communities across the globe. In this course, we will explore migrant stories, key types and causes of migration and policy approaches, and analyse pertinent biblical narratives and theological themes. There will also be opportunities to discuss ways in which migration is transforming churches, as well as ideas for practical responses and ministry. Sessions will encourage students to make connections with their own contexts and experiences of migration.

Catherine of Siena College offers a personal approach to online learning, providing lots of opportunities for live conversation and discussion with other students and the tutor, and staff contacts available to ask any questions or concerns throughout and after the course.
